

Sex Trafficking is:

The Recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for the purpose of a commercial sex act where such an act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion. **Under U.S. federal law**: any minor under the age of 18 years induced into commercial sex is a victim of sex trafficking—regardless of whether or not the trafficker used force, fraud, or coercion.

Youth with a combination of indicators in each circle below may have been trafficked:
